2023 President's Message

NHPA Council Is Fully Staffed

As you read this, we are beginning 2024 with many Council changes. There have been many changes during the year. First, we have had many changes in the Council membership. Jim Kinney, Jr. resigned as Secretary/Treasurer and was replaced by Brian Poole who was the First Vice President at the time. Jim has been very receptive in helping Brian with necessary training. Austin Bailey, who was elected as Fourth Vice President, moved to the First Vice President position. Austin was very interested in working with the Rules/Bylaws area. Jerry Smith retired as of December 31, 2023. Ben Webb of Kentucky was voted by the Council to replace Jerry. Jerry will provide necessary training for Ben. Barb Carson has been appointed to continue her duties as Fourth Vice President. I would like to thank Jim Kinney, Jr and Jerry Smith for training their replacements.



One bright spot of the year was the World Tournament held in Lansing, Michigan. The facility and the closeness of adequate hotel rooms nearby was very convenient. Our Lansing hosts were exceptional. Anything we needed was provided to make our stay very successful. The attendance exceeded expectations as we received 947 entries. The result was some excellent pitching in all divisions. We should not forget our set-up crew who had all the courts available for starting time. Pep Plummer, Clarence Lassiter, Roger Vogel, and many Michigan charter members helped with this effort. We should also thank Empire Photography and Ron and Polly's Horseshoe Pitching Supplies for their presence at our tournament. Hopefully, Lansing will ask us to return in the future.

Another important happening was officially designating the 2024 World Tournament to Tri-Cities (Kennewick) Washington. Our old friend, Kevin Lewis, is now the President and CEO of Tri-Cities Washington. As many of you know, Kevin was our host for the St. George Tournaments. We will be happy to work with Kevin and his staff. The Council has been working on the details of this tournament. Kevin will be willing to host another Tournament in 2027. Shortly thereafter, the 2025 World Tournament was awarded to Salt Lake City, Utah. This will be one of the most beautiful settings you have visited. The Tournament will be held at the Mountain America Exposition Center in the Sandy area. If you have time, please look at the facility on the Internet. Salt Lake City will be willing to host another Tournament in 2028. We have received some very good news about bids for the 2026 World Tournament in the Midwest area.

As I indicated in the last Newsline, the bad thing that happened in 2023 was the continued decline in membership and the lack of new Junior pitchers. The ability to change this decline is the responsibility of the NHPA, State charters, and local clubs. One of our major efforts in 2024 will be to look at any ideas that could have a major impact on membership. We can look at areas who have increased membership and those that have successful clubs.

As you are aware, the NHPA maintains insurance coverage for liability for all clubs and for property that we own, and for Director's and Officer's Insurance. This year the insurance company required us to submit a new packet of information. The result was that the premium doubled since last year. The biggest part of the increase was our Hall of Fame Building. We had been paying based on the value of the property in 2007. Once the real estate people evaluated the current value of the building the value had almost tripled. Obviously, we will get other quotes from other companies for our insurance needs. As you know, our membership continues to decline as expenses continue to increase.

As we approach the Spring pitching season, there will be special tournaments coming up. The 11th Annual Hall of Fame Tournament will be happening on May 4th and May 5th, 2024. This is a great invitational tournament at our Hall of Fame Building. Also, the 38th Team World Tournament will occur on May 17-19 in Beloit, Wisconsin. This is a fantastic tournament. The Greenville Ringer Classic will occur in July, 2024 in Greenville, Ohio. The City of Greenville continues to keep the facility in good shape. The Valley of the Sun Tournament has just completed in Mesa, Arizona.

As we proceed into future years, the primary challenge of increasing membership is our primary focus.

I have spent the last 2 years of my 18-year tenure as an NHPA member working indirectly with the NHPA council as Youth Director, and now directly as NHPA 3rd Vice President. I now see it is time to tap into the technology that is available and bring horseshoe pitching into the 21st century. Utilizing my previous business experience, through my leadership and the support of our great members, we will do just that.

An organization that is growing and thriving is one that will solve its problems head on, instead of deflecting them. We must offer progress instead of the “business-as-usual” approach; the truth instead of promises; partnership instead of disconnection.

In the coming months I will take my message and plan to you. I will talk in more detail about how we will work together as a responsible, responsive, association. I have a new vision that will foster leadership transparency, honesty, and input from members.

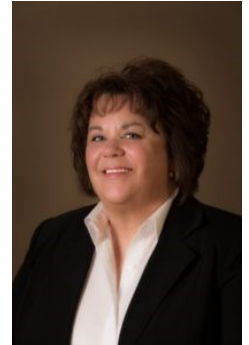

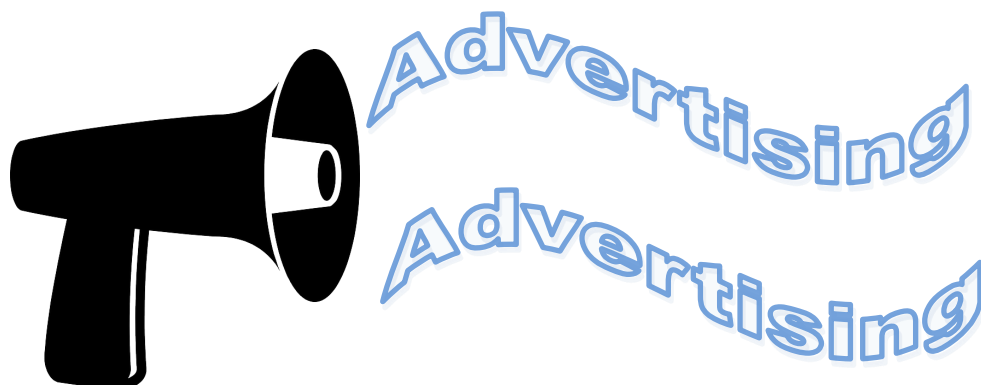
We are continuously reaching out and submitting the NHPA sponsorship opportunities to all persons and companies large and small which contain various dollar amounts for sponsorship opportunities.

FLIGHT TIPS

Many of us are sick of the cold weather and ready for a trip. If you're planning on attending the World Tournament in Kennewick Washington this year, I have researched several travel companies and travel advisors websites, and airlines and these are the tips and the booking sweet spots to capitalize on.



FLIGHT FORECAST

If you're looking to travel somewhere in the country, current airfares are averaging \$256 round-trip, which is down 2% from this time last year.

WANT SOME BOOKING TIPS TO SAVE MONEY ON FLIGHTS?

If you plan on leaving on Tuesday or Wednesday, you could save more than 30% off your total airfare! If you are planning a trip for July, book your flights NOW. Prices are in a good spot. **You should book your trip as early as possible to give you an opportunity to call back later and get a cheaper rate later if the airlines begin to run sales or have discounted ticket prices.**

BEST DEPARTURE AND RETURN DATES:

Whether taking a 2-night, 3-day vacation for the weekend or extending it for a little longer, flying on the right days can **save** travelers. For 3-day weekend trips within the US, plan to depart Saturday and return Monday to **save** an average of \$38 per ticket. For longer 4-day weekend trips, plan to depart Friday and return Monday to **save** just under \$50 per ticket. Traveling mid-week can **save** those heading out on a week-long vacation hundreds of dollars this summer season. Trips starting and ending on Tuesday and Wednesday are 29% to 38% cheaper than departing and returning on peak weekend dates. Starting a week-long vacation mid-week can save travelers as much as \$150 per round trip domestic ticket on average this spring. Domestic travelers can expect to pay under \$250 per ticket for 7-day trips departing on Tuesday or Wednesday, compared to almost \$400 per ticket on Saturday or Sunday.

CAR RENTALS

Considering a road trip to Washington, or planning to pick up a car once you arrive at your destination? You're in luck! Average rates for rental cars this year is \$41 per day nationally, down from \$45 at this time last year. Most travelers are booking 5-day rentals.



For those planning to travel the highway and see the country, relief is expected at the pump as gas prices are down around 15% compared to this time last year.

On Sunday, we're looking at a trampoline park close to the venue of the hall of fame banquet for our event that day. We've also confirmed the return of the youth/adult doubles that we held last year. This year we'll be continuing the inaugural name as the Brian Simmons Memorial Youth/Adult Doubles. As many are already aware, I have formally announced my candidacy for the position of NHPA President in 2024. While I'm positive there will be other candidates, some with more experience, and some with less, I feel this is the right time for me to run for this position.

Someone asked me "You just joined the council, how could you be ready to be President", a very reasonable question. I've worked with the council for 2 years, as the Youth director for 2 years before joining as 3rd VP in 2024. This experience has allowed me to gain firsthand knowledge of the issues with the operations of our association as it stands. In addition to this, I have been an NHPA member for 18 years. Personally, I've been fortunate to gain several years of management and operations experience with my work. Independent of that, I've been involved in the startup and success of more than 5 independent small businesses. Council experience is important, but only if it's good experience, even then it's not the sole factor in a good candidate.

Every candidate to run for the presidency has run on two pillars: Membership Growth and Sponsorship. Meanwhile, we have produced no notable results in either category. We have less members year by year on a sharp membership decline and very, very few sponsors to boot. This has resulted in a consistently shrinking budget causing us to make cuts in areas that affect you, the members that fund the NHPA.

We're at a critical point in our association, a point where we will begin to progress and grow, or we will slowly dissolve as we continue to lose members. We must begin to give more focus to the individual charters, as that's where true membership growth comes from. We must offer potential sponsors something of value to begin to gain that much needed sponsorship. We must begin to lead in a transparent, hand-in-hand, common sense style of leadership to foster those connections with our charters. Focusing more on the needs of the charters and individual members will be critical to our success. While the World Tournament is important, we must divide our focus to spend more time solving the issues that are pushing us in a negative direction.

In this Newsline edition is my official candidacy announcement that was shared on social media. As I mentioned in that announcement, I will not simply promise "membership and sponsorship", I will set forth a plan for our success that we will deliver, together. In the coming editions of the Newsline, I will begin to discuss certain aspects of this plan that I believe will be the keys to our success. I appreciate all the support I've received so far and continue to receive. I encourage anyone who would like to discuss the issues that are important to them to please reach out to me.

League Director Transition

Jerry Smith's processes for league operations has been a definite but interesting learning curve for me. I appreciate Jerry's support during this transition, I also appreciate the patience of all our league directors and members across the country during this period. As of today, I believe I've gotten all the pending leagues entered and patches distributed to the league directors. If you notice one missing that's been submitted, please don't hesitate to let me know. Top 10's for 2023 are currently in the works and should be completed soon.

Our leagues are at the heart of the NHPA. Without local level leagues, the members that support them, and the directors that run them, our association would be much weaker. These local level weekly events at the core of the NHPA keep members invested, bring in new members, and give members a sense of unity that other tournaments simply don't.

I appreciate all of the support of our league directors across the country that keep these leagues going on a weekly basis. One thing I wasn't aware of before taking this position was that we receive several donations to the sanctioned league program every year. It would be impossible to overstate just how appreciated these are and how much they help to drive the program, funding the patches, awards, and materials for it. I encourage anyone who would like to donate to the sanctioned league program to mail that to me and I can get it to Brian. Please ensure the checks are made out to the NHPA, with a memo of "SL Donation" or similar.

“Club vs Club”?

One idea that we have ran in Kentucky for several years is the “club vs club” competition. We’ve ran this program for several years, as just a fun competition between the different clubs in the state, the rules are simple:

- Each club will be matched for a maximum of 40 total games to be played.
- The club that achieves the highest number of games won of the total 40 will be crowned CLUB CHAMPION.
- The CLUB CHAMPION will take possession of the "Traveling Trophy" for the following horseshoe season signifying their victory.
- All chosen matchups are made within classes from our regular season's KHPA events. Matchups are chosen and made at the discretion of the Club VS Club Director.
- Matchups are chosen using a range of 7% ringer percentage as a high/low guide.
- Matchups are tracked on the number of higher or lower percentage of matchups that have been made for each club and will be kept as even AS POSSIBLE.
- Any matchup made that takes place in a class with a "double round robin" will always use only the FIRST meeting between the matched players.
- As the competition nears a conclusion, it will become necessary to use "one-sided" matchups to complete the game totals.
- Each participating club must have at least 5 regular participating KHPA players on their roster.
- With a 5 Player minimum, no player will exceed more than 9 games played during the competition.
- It is the responsibility of each Club's designated leader to supply the Club VS Club Director with an updated roster with legitimate club players and to encourage enough participation from their club players throughout the season to complete the designated 40 total games.
- Any player on a club's roster must be a regular or semi-regular in that club's weeknight sanctioned or non-sanctioned league.
- A player may only participate for ONE club of choice if they play in more than one club on a regular basis.

At the end of the season, typically at the State tournament, the team with the most wins will take possession of the traveling club vs club trophy. Each year the trophy is updated with the winning team’s plate.



March Madness – Best NHPA Youth Pitcher!*Ben Webb-4th Vice President*

As promised in the last edition of the Newsline, attached is the 64-youth pitcher bracket to determine the greatest youth pitcher in NHPA history. Keep in mind that these are solely opinions of a small panel of NHPA members where the only factors are World Tournament based as well. Unfortunately, compiling different states records for something like this would be a huge, nearly impossible task. The seeding factors were:

- World Tournament Championships
- World Tournament Prelim Class Wins (A-class)
- Averages in the World Tournament
- Appearances Strength of class at time of performance

The panel has populated the bracket and determined the “Elite Eight” the finals will be announced in the next Newsline. Undoubtedly, this bracket has produced some predictable results with few upsets so far. Were these games to play out, with the pitchers in their prime youth years, there would certainly be some lengthy games between them. One of the most interesting matches in the “sweet 16” could’ve very possibly happened, as Sarah Chaffee met Derek Reynolds. This was a very tough call, seeing both in recent years. One factor that was used for Sarah was her performances the last couple of years. Even though Sarah pitched in the Women’s division, her age made her eligible to pitch in the Youth division. Because of this, we used these stats when looking at her game by game in the bracket. The “Elite Eight” shows: Jim Walters vs Jeffery Williams playing the winner of Sarah Chaffee vs Kipp Barody. Across the bracket we’d see Walter Ray Williams Jr vs Mark Seibold playing the winner of Alan Francis vs Steven Hohl. The most interesting aspect here would be if Jeffery could survive Jim Walters and the winner of Chaffee/Barody, while Walter Ray gets through Seibold and the winner of Francis/Hohl. This would set up a final game that took place in the early 1970’s, a brother vs brother match, one more time? That’s only if both of their individual stats can push them both to the finals.

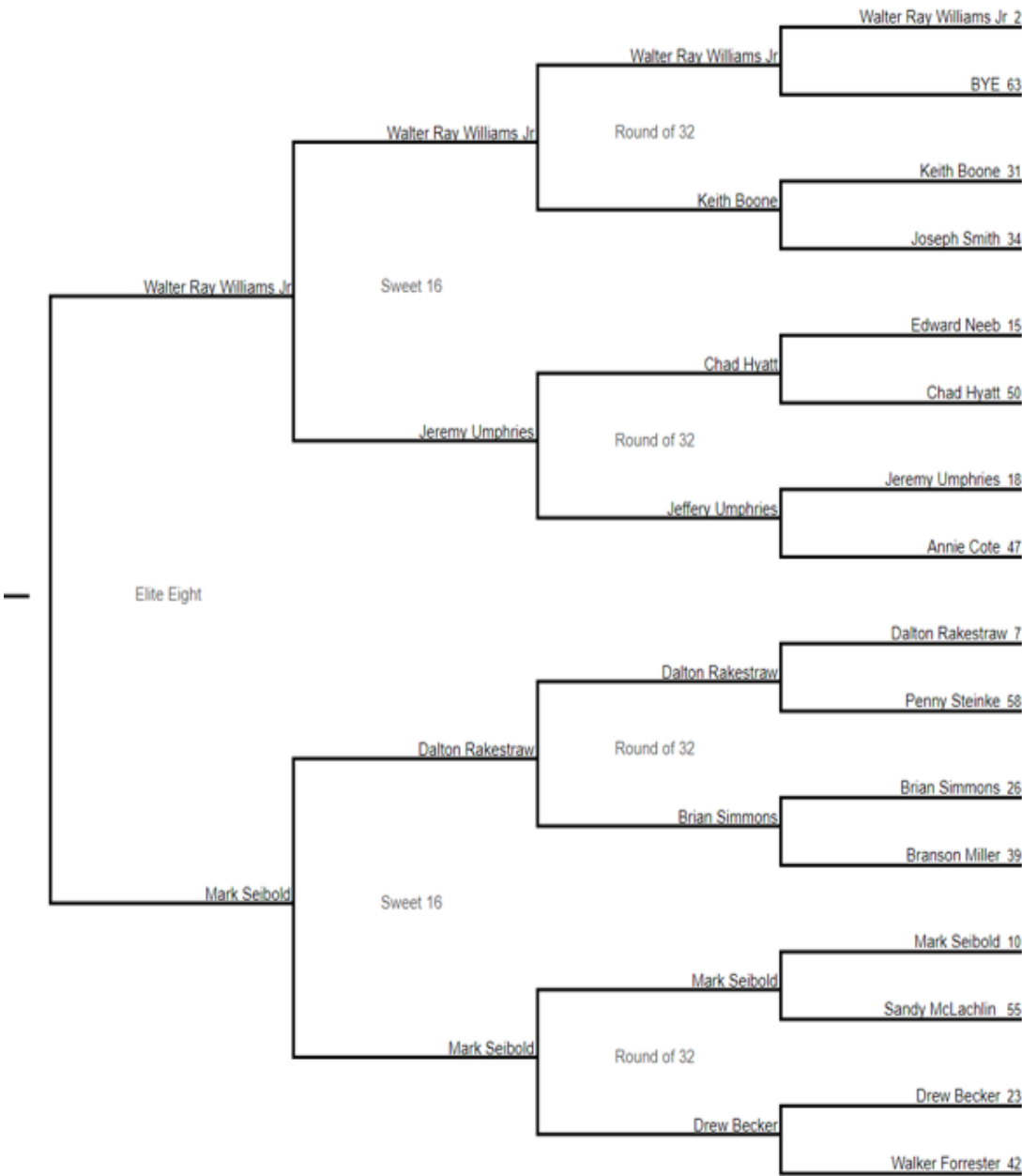

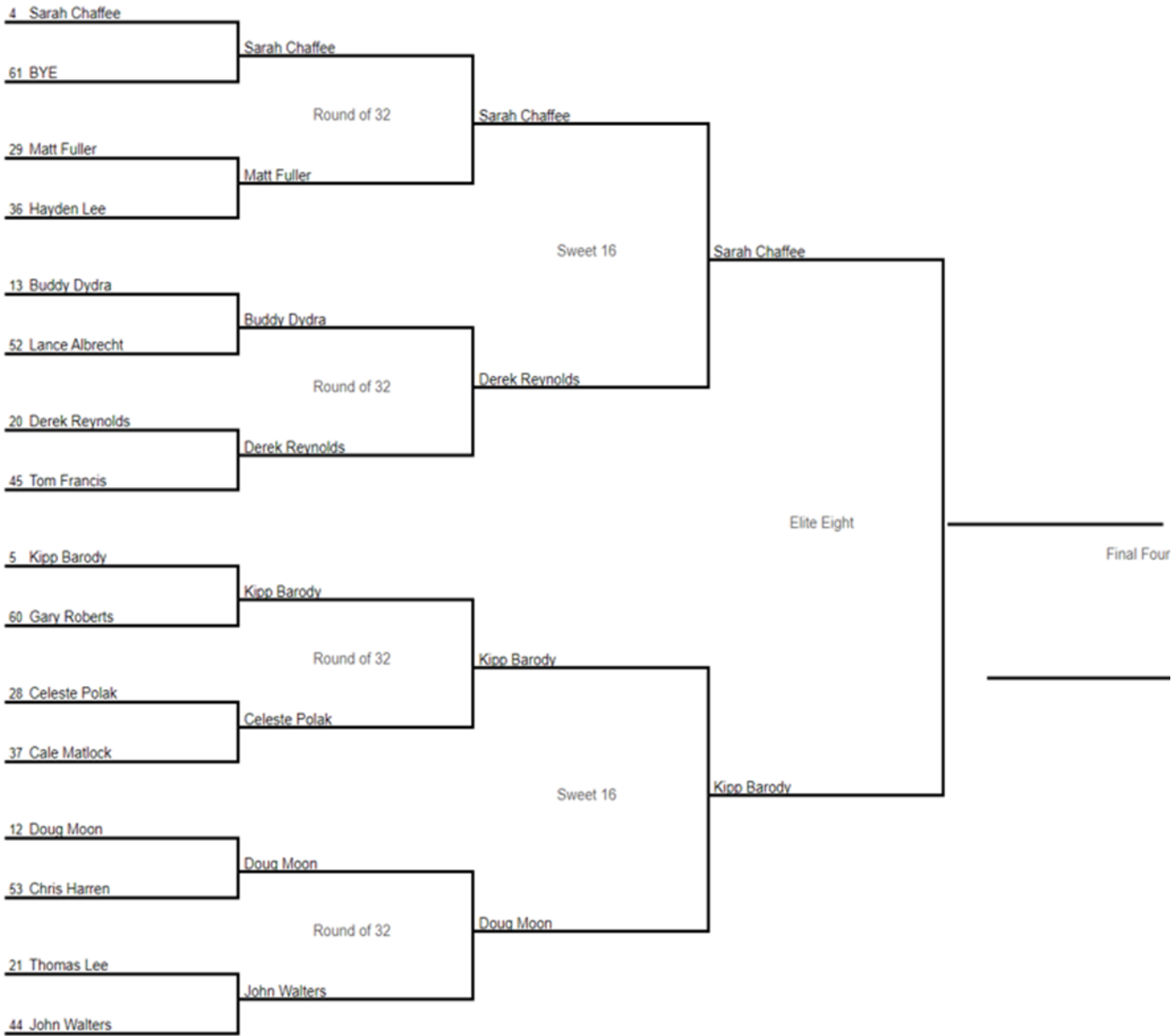


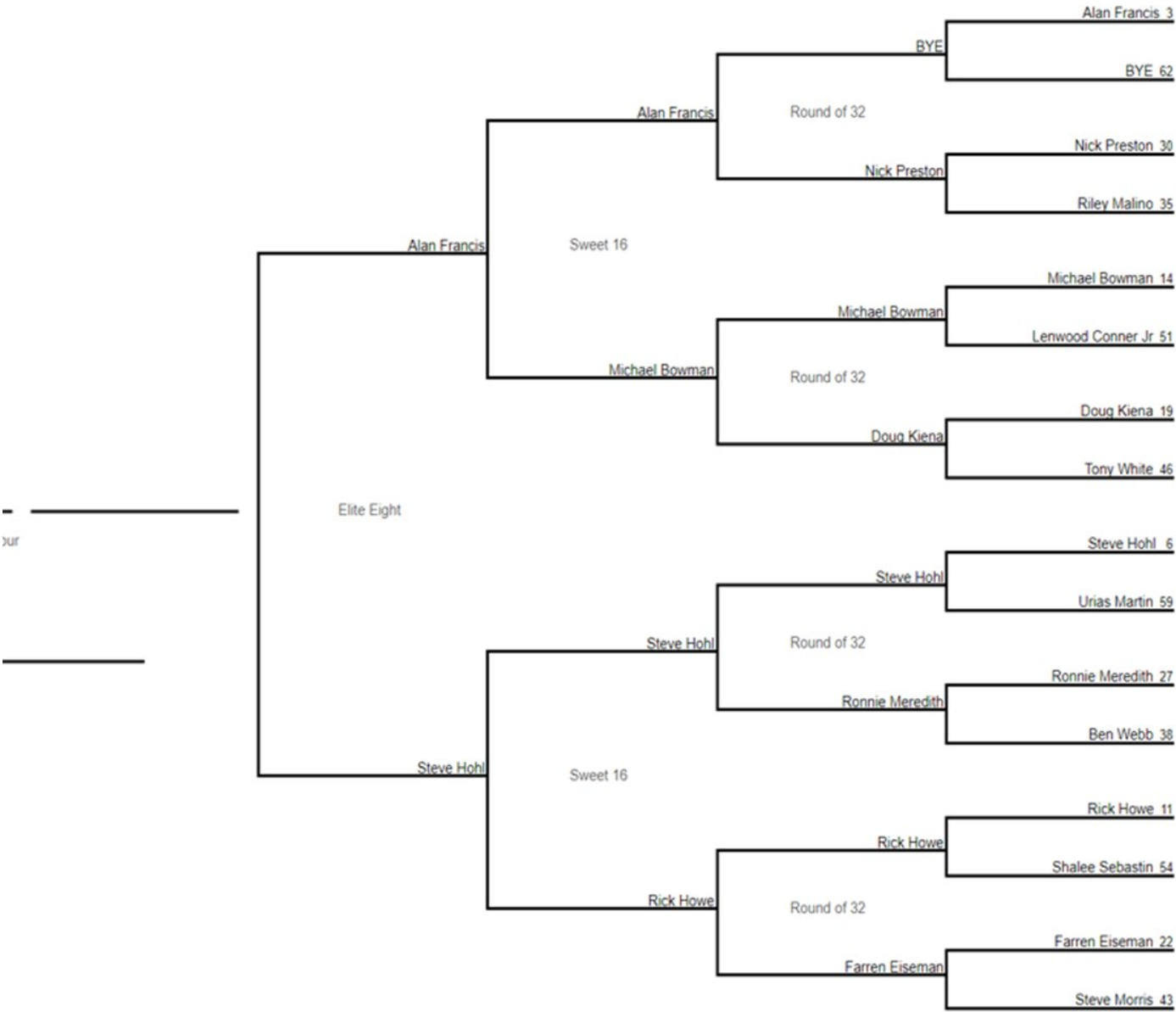
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Patch update

Only Sanction Tournaments are in eShoe, therefore you no longer have to fill out a Certificate for each Tournament. You will notice that we left the year on the patches for this year. Thank you to everyone that submitted your Charter Votes. We heard your comments and the majority of the Charter Votes were to leave the year on them. We will be discussing this topic again this year during the Charter President/RD and League Meeting at the 2024 World Tournament in Kennewick, Washington. Please keep in mind the cost of the patches have increased significantly and how many patches that are thrown away at the end of your season. That is money that is being thrown away because you can't use them for the next year. Also, please keep in mind that the year will remain on all State Tournament patches. This would decrease the number of patches and the cost for the next year because if you have Class Champion patches left over, you can use them for the next year and your Patch Order will decrease. Tournament dates are July 29 – August 10, 2024. Please see Laurie Lampkin, 2nd VP for more information on Hotels and/or RV Parks and where to eat and to shop.

Three Rivers Campus

Toyota Center and Toyota Arena, located right next door to each other, offer a combined 44,000 sq. ft. of playable floor space for the NHPA World Tournament. Just steps away is the stunning Three Rivers Convention Center, a 75,000 sq. ft. facility, offering multiple breakout rooms and Great Hall space for tournament goers to utilize. Camera Update for World Tournament 2024 and more

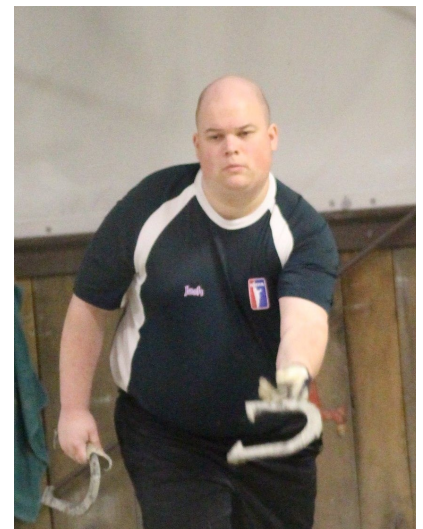

World Tournament Preparation Is Underway

Dear NHPA Members,

Hello Horseshoe Pitchers. It is still cold here in Idaho and I have been busy with Patrolling for our local ski hill, Pebble Creek, and snowmobiling here in Idaho. I hope all of you are staying active and doing something you enjoy.

My thoughts for this article are to give everyone my tentative schedule for the World Tournament in Kennewick.

July 29-31 will have 96 pitchers from Men's, Women's, Sr Men's, Sr Women's, and Elders vying for a top position based on percentage for the Championships on Aug 1-3. The youth will pitch in the evening, as usual, on Aug 1-3, Preliminaries on Aug 1-2, Championship on Aug 3.

Looking at the last 2 years the percentage cutoff is between 35 - 37 percent. It all depends on the number of entries where the cutoff will be.

The next week, Aug 5-10 will be lower percentage pitchers (0-25%) on Aug 5-7, and the remaining pitchers (25-35%) on Aug 8-10. This is my tentative proposed schedule.

With the courts we have planned to setup, we can handle 1,152 participants using 4 shifts each day. There is some room to add more shifts if needed and we will do what we need to to make this a great tournament. We just need everyone that can to get your entry form submitted early. Use the form in this Newline or the one on our website. You can also enter online from our website.

The council has developed our budget for 2024 and it will all depend on the number of NHPA members that join if we are good or in the red for this year. We based it on our numbers for last year and hope that will be low and we change the current trend of losing more members each year. This is not just a council problem about membership. It is every NHPA member's problem. We can't exist and keep providing a World Tournament every year if we don't work together and increase our membership back to where it was.

Thanks for your support and please call if you have questions and I will do my best to help you find an answer.

We've all visited a museum at some point in our lives, whether it was during a school field trip or with family on vacation. Approximately 850 million people visit American museums each year, but have you ever stopped to wonder how many people that museum impacted or why it came to be?

The purpose of modern museums is to collect, preserve, interpret, and display objects of artistic, cultural, or scientific significance for the study and education



of the public. To city leaders, an active museum community can be seen as a gauge of the cultural or economic health of a city, and a way to increase the sophistication of its inhabitants. Museums are, above all, storehouses of knowledge. In 1829, James Smithson's bequest funding the Smithsonian Institution stated that he wanted to establish an institution "for the increase and diffusion of knowledge"

Museum purposes vary from institution to institution. Generally speaking, museums collect objects of significance that comply with their mission statement for conservation and display. Apart from questions of provenance and conservation, museums take into consideration the former use and status of

an object. On display in the NHPA's museum are many items portraying the history of our sport. But there is more. Also located within the museum is the National Horseshoe Pitchers Hall of Fame.

What is the Hall of Fame? A hall, wall, or walk of fame is a list of individuals, achievements, or other entities, usually chosen by a group of electors and honored by enshrinement, those individuals who had exceptional careers, and recognizing others for their significant achievements. 178 individuals have been inducted since 1966 when the first 7 charter members were named. Their list of accomplishments and achievements is truly amazing as well as inspiring. It's all there in a display at the museum as well as on the NHPA website.

Also within the museum you can see several plaques recognizing donors who have, over the years, contributed amounts of \$500 or more. On the NHPF website you can also see a list of "Legacy Donors". This list contains names of individuals, NHPA Charters, horseshoe pitching clubs, and various other entities who have cumulatively given \$2000.00 or more.



We invite you to visit the Hall of Fame and Museum and of course, your support is always welcome.

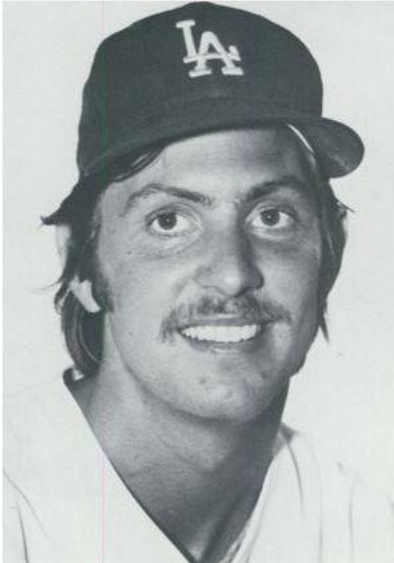

Transition from Baseball in the Big Leagues to Horseshoes

Playing in the major leagues is only just a dream for most parents and children. Always asking yourself if they have what it takes to make it? Are they just chasing a dream? Google suggests 0.5% of high schoolers will play collegiate sports then be drafted to the majors. If making it big was only a dream, there is one man who made that dream a reality! The Southern California Horseshoe Pitching Association has the opportunity to make it big with the celebrities in Hollywood! Being so close makes it a little more surreal to achieve those big names... Ellen DeGeneres, Kim Kardashian, but have you heard of Rick Auerbach? He lives in Calabasas amongst those famous names. Rich is a retired Major League Baseball player!

Born February 15, 1950, in Woodland Hills, California, Rick Auerbach wouldn't know just yet what talent had transpired in him. Growing up Rick states, "I was a very fast runner and had a good arm. I lived baseball and played and practiced as much as I could but honestly to make it to the big leagues, it was really a God given talent." Growing up Rick wasn't sure he

had what it took, but as time progressed, he soon found out. He would sign a contract deal faster than he thought. "I was offered a 13th round pick in the 1968 MLB draft when I completed high school. However, I chose to play junior college and I had only played one year. I was then a pick in the secondary draft of the 1969 and I had a professional contract to sign. I had no college degree completed, I went and started playing for the MLB."

Rick signed with the Seattle Pilots who became the team we call the Milwaukee Brewers in 1971,72,&73. He was then traded to the Los Angeles Dodgers in 1974,75,&76. Traded again to the Cincinnati Reds for 1977-1980, he finally played his last MLB season in 1981 with the Seattle Mariners. He played short stop position and says "it's the best spot in the house." Rick ended his MLB career with a batting average of .220 with 9 home runs and 86 RBI's!

Upon his retirement from the MLB, he soon found himself back in California, and started bowling. Rick would find himself on the bowling lanes far more now that his majors retirement came. He would bowl several 300 games and carry a bowling average around 260. There is a video on YouTube "Rick Auerbach bowls a 300 game." He would be a horse Ferrier by day and an avid bowler come night. "I was a bowler and the torque on my knee with a 16lb bowling ball caught up with me." Rick was looking for something to do. Bending, reaching, pulling, tugging, prying and all the things that would cause the body to be uncomfortable after a while. Rick was working on a horse one day when one of his shoeing friends mentioned to try pitching horseshoes since they were only 2lbs compared to a 16lb ball

Rick states "I have never previously pitched horseshoes before. My friend just suggested it and they were pitching tournaments." Rick found his way to the NHPA horseshoe court soon after. Rick would sign up and become a member and really start to excel at the game. Ending last year with an average of 63.48% "I think a lot of my success in horseshoes can be related to the MLB. Pitching horseshoes combines hand-eye coordination along with concentration and along with a release point, just like baseball."

Rick is a gentleman and a scholar. He definitely keeps his status under wraps. I would have never known anything if he didn't tell me. However Rick did say "Dalton you're 27, I wouldn't expect you to know me playing MLB." We both laughed. I asked Rick what is more nerve-wrecking pitching horseshoes or playing MLB?

His response, "I believe playing for the Reds Big Machine and the Dodgers with 50,000 fans in the stadium watching you every minute, waiting for you to perform with accuracy, and win for them, is just a little more pressure than pitching sanctioned horseshoes."

Rick is a one of a kind on the courts, when he strings his ringers, his form is impeccable and his release point is on target each time. He is a real nice guy to pitch against. Rick has not been California State Champion...yet. However, he has the title of Southern California 30' Champion. Of the 12 tournaments he played last year, he won 8.

If Rick is at the world tournament, or if you happen to come to Southern California to pitch, ask him to pitch a quick game to 21, see how far you can get, because boom, boom, boom, game over.

Defeated Champ Popular With the Horseshoe Fans

"Putt" Mossman, the 19-year-old horseshoe wizard, who successfully pitched through two national championship meets but who went down in defeat at the hands of a fellow Iowan—"War Horse" Jackson—was perhaps one of the most popular champions the game has ever known or ever will know.

Mossman has made friends throughout the United States, pitching exhibition games here and there. His keen eyesight and never-failing ringer ability is attributed to clean habits and a gentlemanly character—a thing that cannot always be said of champions in other lines of sport.

Mossman is defeated but he will not soon be forgotten as perhaps the most popular champion of the horseshoe realm.

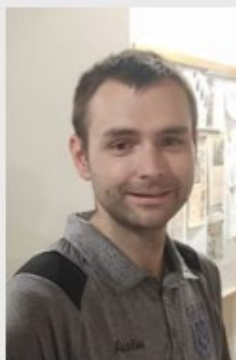
