Focusing on OUR Future, from the Ground Up

Ben Webb, NHPA President

The 2024 World Tournament in the Tri-cities has now passed as have many state tournaments, most around the country now begin to set their sights on the holiday season and fall/winter tournaments.

I'd like to begin with saying how appreciative I am of all the support I received during my campaign for the NHPA presidency and how grateful I am for all those who went to their delegates and charter officials expressing their opinions to elect me to the position. On August 4th, 2024, a landslide vote was taken to elect me as your new NHPA president...a landslide vote was made for change. The NHPA council has long been focused on just the world tournament, rarely looking be-



yond that to solve the everyday problems causing our membership decline. This way of thinking is over. The vote at the convention was a vote for change, not necessarily just change in face, but change in direction and ideologies that are the difference makers for the councils and associations progression. As I mentioned in the letter I sent out to every charter, my first month in office has consisted of much foundational restructuring. I am currently working on implementing brand new systems and processes that will not only make things more seamless for council business and everyday members but will bring in those much-needed funds and help us grow our membership.

One of the first steps that needed to be taken though was some restaffing. Upon my election, the 3rd Vice President position became vacant and the 2nd Vice President position also became vacant in August with Laurie's resignation from the council. We have been taking applications for these positions and conducting interviews with each interested candidate. Along with the VP vacancies, the youth director position was vacated, and 3 new director roles were created. The roles of youth director, promotions director, sponsorship director, and social media director were all posted and followed the same application process as the VP openings. After much consideration and reviewing all credentials of the qualified parties, appointments for all these positions have now been made. As you read through these appointments, you will notice a couple of familiar names. There are some things for everyone to keep in mind. Any individual who joins the council, committee or serves as a director must embrace this widened, progressive thinking of working beyond the world tournament. We will always present a great world tournament as an association, but we will work beyond that in avenues we've rarely, if ever, explored. I encourage everyone to take these appointments as they are, give each of these appointments your full support and a chance of success. I'm positive we will not be disappointed if we give a fair chance to each individual as we watch them, and their roles grow and the success that stems from that. Youth, their protection, development and growth of their division, will always be at the forefront of my administration as NHPA president. We received a few applications for our NHPA youth director opening and have chosen what I believe to be the best candidate for the role.

Aleena Lepak of Wisconsin served as the youth director for the NHPA from 2012 – 2019 before stepping away from the position to begin her family. Aleena furthered her education, completing her bachelor's degree, and feels it's the right time for her to step back into NHPA leadership as her family is now complete. During Aleena's time as youth director she was able to make those personal connections with those in the division that few adults are ever able to make. Her application stressed that she felt she could do much more than she was able to accomplish with the full backing of a forward thinking NHPA and I believe Aleena will do great things with our Youth Division in the years to come!

The NHPA has never been great about embracing advancements in technology, especially online. As the world shifts more and more into the online space, so must we. That is why we're appointing an official NHPA social media director. We had a couple of applications for this opening, but the choice was very clear here. Michelle Foard of Minnesota began and grew her TikTok channel several years ago. Michelle has taken an active role not only on TikTok but on Facebook as well and will be expanding the NHPA's social media footprint to TikTok, Instagram, and X very shortly. Michelle will work directly with our promotion department as we create and distribute more and more promotional materials online and use these tools of social media to advertise our sport to the next generation.

Sponsorship was another major topic I campaigned on. We, the NHPA, have for years failed to obtain many outside sponsors, this is largely in part due to sponsorship being on the backburner falling in a broad description of VP responsibilities, and a sponsorship model that was simply unattractive to potential sponsors. In the coming days, we'll be rolling out a brand-new sponsorship model that will yield much more success for us. At the forefront of this though will be our newly appointed sponsorship director. After much consideration, we have chosen Donald Sorenson of Utah as the NHPA's sponsorship director. Don has served as a vice president for Northern Utah for 4 years and has worked in management for over a decade, 5 of those years being in sales management. Currently, Don works as inventory control for a major food and beverage distributor, I have zero doubt that with Don's professional background and a newly introduced sponsorship model we are on the road to gaining those much-needed sponsorships.

Promotion and Sponsorship have long been paired under a single VP. It's simply impossible to fully do these roles together. Therefore, we have appointed a promotions director as well. Both directors will work with the VP responsible for that area of the NHPA and oversee their respective committees. Our promotions director will work together with charters to aid in promotional efforts on a local level. Along with their committee, they'll brainstorm, create, and implement new promotional ideas that will help grow our membership where it must begin on a charter level. Membership grows on a local, charter level, but now the NHPA will take a leading step in working together with those charters in their efforts to grow their membership and promote their events. Our selection for the NHPA's Promotion Director has served as 4th vice president and youth director for the past year in the Southern California charter and has a career in advanced behavioral therapy. The NHPA welcomes Lucy Strong to our team as the newest promotion director! Lucy has many great ideas and is very enthusiastic about the future of our sport!

We have two council appointments to make, but many of the current roles will be shifting as we restructure our staff. The current council responsibilities will be as follows, effective immediately:

Austin Bailey of Illinois is our 1st Vice President and will be shifting responsibilities. Austin will now oversee Sponsorship, working directly with Don and his committee. Austin will also oversee other revenue generating opportunities for the NHPA such as working directly with our Amazon vendor. Austin will also be serving as the NHPA grievance director, overseeing that committee.

Dalton Rakestraw of Southern California will be joining the NHPA council as our 2nd Vice President. Dalton will take on the role of World Tournament Coordinator and oversee our Promotion/Publicity area, working directly with Lucy and her committee. Dalton has had much success working with Southern California and I have no doubt that Dalton will produce much success for the NHPA in this role.

Jerry Labrosse of Minnesota will be also joining the NHPA council as our 3rd Vice President. Jerry will oversee World Tournament setup to ensure a consistent, high-quality setup each year. He will be working to upgrade and maintain our equipment and will also be taking on rules and bylaws. As the council has shifted to being a majority of younger leadership, I believe Jerry's historical knowledge and prior experiences within our sport will be very helpful as we set the NHPA up for years of success.

Barbara Carson of Ohio is our 4th Vice President and will also be shifting responsibilities. Barbara will continue to oversee the Regional Directors but will be taking on the responsibility of NHPA sanctioned league director. One of the most important areas of the NHPA is the sanctioned league program. I believe that Barb's many years of work experiences will aid her in maintaining and expanding the Sanctioned League program.

Josh Olson of Minnesota is our 5th Vice President and his responsibilities will remain largely unchanged. While maintaining our World Tournament systems, Josh will continue to explore and implement technological advancements where applicable to keep the NHPA up to speed with the changing times.

Brian Poole of Idaho is our Secretary/Treasurer, and his responsibilities in that role will remain unchanged for the time being.

We have made some significant changes to our committees as well; those appointments will be announced via Facebook once all the committees are filled. I expect to make an announcement on this no later than September 15. Historically, our committees haven't functioned as productively as they should have. Our established committees will meet monthly via zoom and will have brand new guidelines and SOPs to guide them. Our committee chairs will be assigned as follows:

The next couple of months will be filled with more foundational work as we begin to lay the footing for the new promotional, sponsorship and membership incentive programs we'll be rolling out very soon. Stay tuned to the NHPA eBlasts and Newsline for those updates. I hope everyone had a great state tournament for those who have already held theirs and best of luck to those with their state events yet to come!

Rules/Bylaws Voting Results - 2024 Delegate Meeting

Note: All Rules/Bylaws approved are effective October 1st, 2024 at the beginning of the 2025 membership year

PBC 1 Summary: A charter is entitled to one delegate for being an active charter with the NHPA and an additional delegate for every 50 NHPA members.

Votes cast: 45

No: 3 Yes: 42

Passed - Total delegates per charter will be determined based on # of NHPA members

PBC 2 Summary: Candidates for NHPA office must announce candidacy no later than April 1st. Incumbents must announce by February 1st. No nominations will be accepted from the floor of the convention if they did not meet the submission deadline.

Votes cast: 46

No: 11 Yes: 35

Passed - No nominations accepted from the floor of the convention if they did not meet the submission deadline.

PBC 3 Summary: Proposal to change the decision location for the World Tournament future locations from the NHPA Executive Council to the members for a vote.

Votes cast: 50 No: 40 Yes: 10

Failed - Proposals for future World Tournament locations will continue to be determined by the NHPA Executive Council.

PBC 4 Summary: Proposal to change the deadline for submitting rules and bylaws changes from September 30th to February 1st of the voting year.

Votes cast: 49

No: 2 Yes: 47

Passed - Deadline for rules/bylaws changes was changed from September 30th to February 1st of the voting year.

PRC 1 Summary: Proposal to change the age for Cadets to be reduced from twelve (12) years old or younger to ten (10) years old or younger.

Votes cast: 53

No: 46 Yes: 7

Failed - Cadet age will remain at twelve (12) years old or younger for the entire calendar year.

PRC 2 Summary: Elder Women age 65 and older may pitch from any place on either the extended or full distance platforms and shall observe the twenty-foot (20') foul line.

Votes cast: 52

No: 6 Yes: 46

Passed: Elder Women age 65 and older may pitch from any place on either the extended or full distance platforms and shall observe the twenty-foot (20') foul line.

Note: eShoe will be ready to support the new Elder Women distance as a new division—We welcome everyone to consider pitching with the NHPA!

PRC 2 "Senior Women" - Effective October 1st, 2024!!!

Rule 1 Current Wording

Section F - Elder Men (become eligible to pitch in the Elders Division upon purchase of an NHPA card dated for the calendar year that they become sixty-five (65) years old).

1. Elder Men may pitch from any place on either the extended or full-distance platforms, and shall observe the twentyseven-foot (27') foul line. Elder Men must notify their Charter Membership Director, in advance, of the date that they intend to begin pitching from this shorter distance. Once a member declares himself a short-distance pitcher, he must remain in that Division until the next year's membership card is purchased. At that time he may switch back to the Open Men's division, but must remain in that division until the next year's membership card is purchased.
Note: See Rule 11, Section D.1 for additional information about re-qualifying.

2. Physically Challenged Men - Physically challenged, Male pitchers less than sixty-five (65) years old may be given permission, by their governing Charter, to move onto the extended platforms in the Elders Division and observe the twenty-seven-foot (27') foul lines. The prior completion and approval of a Medical Exemption Application form (available from Charter Secretaries and on some Charter Websites) is required. At the World Tournament and at State Championship Tournaments, they shall compete in the Elders Division





I got to work with him during 8 (I believe) of these and see first hand the joy this brought him.

I would like to thank former NHPA Presidents Dave Louckes, Paul Stewart, and Stu Sipma for keeping him on for so many tournaments."

Answers to your eShoe questions

I have been part of the eShoe program since its inception. I believe this program has been the best thing for tracking membership and events since HSMaster was created. Kurt Whaley is the one who created both. Kurt has updated many things within the program over the years and is still trying to make the program better each year to fit the NHPA's needs. I work with Kurt closely on a regular basis to make sure we make eShoe run as smooth as possible without any issues for the charters. As eShoe Director I have the job of monitoring and assigning user access for each charter. We try to keep the user count to two or three, so we do not have too many people from each charter working over each other. This has worked out well since the beginning. I am the main contact for eShoe issues, and this has worked out well. If there is any change in membership director/secretary in a charter please



contact me. If I do not have the answer to an issue, I will contact the one that does. This eliminates the problem of having too many hands in the pot and gives everyone a single contact point. Billing and invoice issues for charter membership will be overseen by Brian Poole, NHPA Sec/Treas.

I wanted to address a couple of issues that I have already encountered over the years. One issue is when a member goes to the NHPA website and renews their membership online. Sometimes the wrong button is chosen when renewing. There is a "Join" button and a "Renew" button when prompted. The "Join" button is for just those who have never held a membership in the NHPA in the past. The "Renew" Button is for a member who is currently or has been an NHPA member in past years. If the "Join" button is used by a current, or past, member the program generates a new membership number for that member. Creating a new membership number does one of three things.

- 1) It is possible that the member now has two membership numbers associated with their name in eShoe.
- 2) if the member has pitched in any events using their current number there will be no record of this associated with their new number.
- 3) The new membership number will not have the correct years of membership associated with the member's original number.

If this happens the eShoe director needs to be notified before anything is deleted or changed so the eShoe director can correct the issue. This is so the charter is credited with the right billing on the quarterly invoice that is sent by the NHPA Sec/Treas. This is any easy fix but needs to be addressed prior to any corrections.

Another issue that has been sent to me in the past is members moving divisions. When a member moves divisions, the charter membership director/Secretary does this, most of the time. If a member has pitched in any events before moving, then those events will not be seen. Events pitched in the current division will not count after the move into a new division. A new average will need to be established for the new division. If a member has pitched in a different division then the one that is in eShoe and the division was not changed prior to the event the charter membership director/Secretary, charter Events director, or the NHPA eShoe director will have to go to each tournament pitched and change the distance recorded for the member and save. Then they will have to go to the members name in eShoe and change the division assigned to them.

If anyone is moving from one charter to another they will have to be move by the charter membership director/Secretary that they are currently a member of, or myself. The membership number will move with the member. The membership numbers are for life, unless there are arrangements made.

Answers to Your eShoe Questions...Continued

Updates are being worked on as I am drafting this article. We will keep everyone updated as they are implemented. Any of the issues addressed or issues that are associated with reporting tournaments or leagues can be corrected without any problems. Just contact me by email or phone provided in my closing if you have any questions.

Hope everyone is having a great year and see you on the courts.
