Barb Carson — Ohio

Barb Carson has been a regional director in two different states assuming the duties to perfection. She took over sanctioning courts, ordering patches, issuing tournament sanctions and truly taking over the RD world. Barb was the Statroom Director at the world tournament for five years before ending and becoming an NHPA Officer in 2021.

Since then Barb is now chairperson of the Regional Directors and has since taken over as National League Director. She has been inducted into two Hall of Fames.

She currently resides in North Olmsted, Ohio, where she works countless hours ordering RD supplies and inputing leagues into eShoe. Barb won this award for her countless and selfless hours of devotion to our sport in many aspects.



Darryl Miller — Ohio

Perhaps the easiest decision I made during my first year as NHPA President was the selection of the 2025 Presidential Award winner. As the NHPA lost their leader in Gary Roberts, Ohio would also lose Gary as their long standing President. Darryl Miller would arise as the new Ohio President, stepping into a tough position as they tried to navigate the loss. Prior to this, Darryl had been an Ohio Vice President and Regional Director for several years. Embodying the true spirit of our sport, Darryl has always been an example of a horseshoe pitcher capable of recruiting new members. Millers friendly persona, down to earth attitude and strong leadership consistent with his and the NHPA's core values make him a perfect selection to progress the Ohio charter. As the NHPA charters are the heart of the overall association, Darryl's willingness to step up to the plate combined with his other attributes made him the clear choice to received the 2025 NHPA Presidential Award.



Hall of Fame 2025



Roger Vogel — Kansas

Player Category—Roger Vogel has been a distinguished NHPA member and elite horseshoe pitcher for over 40 years. Beginning his career as a junior in Illinois, Roger quickly rose through the ranks, winning multiple state championships and achieving national recognition. He competed in 24 World Tournaments, qualifying for the Men's Championship Class 11 times with a remarkable career average of 73.76% and over 20,000 ringers. His best World finishes include 2nd as a junior (1954) and 6th in 1973, with nine appearances exceeding 70% accuracy.

Roger is the only pitcher in NHPA history to win Men's State Championships in five different states—Illinois, Colorado, New Mexico, Texas, and Arizona-demonstrating unmatched consistency and skill across decades.



David Sidles - Nebraska

Promoter/Organizer Category—David Sidles has been a dedicated member of the NHPA for over 31 years, serving as a leader, innovator, and promoter of the sport. Based in Omaha, Nebraska, he has significantly influenced the organization's operations and technological modernization.

He began pitching in 1989 with the Central Iowa Traveling League, later serving in key leadership roles including Iowa State Charter Secretary/Treasurer and NHPA Board Vice President. David computerized NHPA bookkeeping and membership systems, modernized tournament reporting, and streamlined award processing—transformations that improved accuracy and efficiency nationwide.

Sidles directed state tournaments, served as commissioner for the Iowa Games and Nebras-ka State Fair, and received numerous awards, including the Frank Jackson Award and the Arch Stokes Award.



Hall of Fame



Monte J. Latino—California

Player Category—(1916–2007) Monte was a legendary figure in the horseshoe pitching community, admired for his exceptional skill, sportsmanship, and lifelong dedication to the sport. A native of Sacramento, California, Monte was a member of the NHPA for over 40 years and a respected competitor, mentor, and ambassador for horseshoe pitching.

Monte achieved extraordinary success as the Intermediate World Champion for three consecutive years (1980, 1981, and 1982), ranking sixth all-time in wins in the Intermediate Men's Division. Known for consistently throwing in the high 80-percent range, he also won numerous AA Division tournaments across California.

Beyond his accolades, Monte was a beloved promoter of the sport, inspiring participation through his enthusiasm, charisma, and demonstrations at fairs and tournaments.







Jerry Smith Progressive Leadership Award



Jerry Smith — Ohio

In 2025, we began looking within the NHPA administration and the history of several of our awards. We determined that we didn't have an award for someone who had been heavily involved in the leadership of the NHPA, whether that be an officer, director, committee member, etc. we needed a way to recognize those who constantly move the needle forward at the national level. While there were several former officers we could've chose to name this newly established award after, the choice quickly became obvious.

Jerry Smith spent many of his years dedicated as an officer in both California and Idaho before joining the NHPA council. Within the NHPA council, Jerry's primary role was managing the sanctioned league program, one of the most taxing jobs for an NHPA official. Jerry would attend the world tournament and run shifts, even after his

resignation from the official council. Jerry continues to serve as the NHPA historian and continues. to be available to help both Barb and others on the council when we're looking for insight on a topic. Jerry's "never back down" attitude, his constant willingness and desire to try new things from an administrative level, and his integrity while serving the board has earned him almost every possible award over the years, including an induction into the NHPA Hall of Fame. Jerry was influential to several of those joining the board including Austin Bailey, Dalton Rakestraw, Josh Olson, myself and several other directors and committee members over his tenure. Jerry's desire to progress the association during his tenure and now after he's stepped away from the council is exemplary of anyone wanting to get involved with NHPA leadership. Leadership in a progressive direction is always met with adversity from an established routing that, at times, needs to be changed for an association to grow. Jerry's consistent example of this lead us to establish, and present for the first time the 2025 Jerry Smith Progressive Leadership award to it's namesake at the 2025 Hall of Fame banquet!





Karen Graham - New York

Karen Graham's journey in horseshoes began in 1994 when, inspired by NHPA legends at the World Tournament, she resolved to compete herself.

Beyond competition, Karen has been a pillar of leadership in the New York State HPA, serving as Tournament Director, Newsletter Editor, Website Manager, Hall of Fame Committee member, and was inducted into the NYSHPA Hall of Fame in 2009 as both a pitcher and promoter. She also helped launch Sanctioned Horseshoes Online Pitching (S.H.O.P.) during the pandemic, managing entries, finances, and results, and is one of only three players to pitch a perfect S.H.O.P. game.

Her tireless contributions, flawless organization, and dedication to promoting the sport make her a deserving recipient of the 2025 League Director of the Year Award.



Scott Kline — Colorado

The recipient of the 2025 Regional Director of the Year has been a member of the NHPA/ CHPA for 14 years. He has been a great help with club activities such as the yearly court cleanup, leagues and tournament setups and promoting membership. He has committed his time and energy to help keep the sport of horses going in Colorado. He is ready with answers from the charter members regarding rules and sanctioning courts.

The past 2 years he has worked with the Silt Colorado Club in installing six new courts. This is a first ever for that town. Besides his RD duties, he also runs 3 tournaments. He runs the CHPA State Singles fundraiser, the Irish Open, and the CHPA tournament of champions. He helps maintain the Ted Allen courts in Boulder and he sanctions Pueblo's portable courts every year for the tournament indoors. Larry Thomason has been a driving force in supporting horseshoe pitching and clubs throughout Southern Illinois. Beginning his service in New Jersey before moving to Effingham, IL, he has held nearly every leadership role within the Effingham Horseshoe Club, including Secretary/Treasurer, President, and League Director. Larry has worked tirelessly to grow membership, keep courts maintained, and ensure tournaments continued even in difficult times.

Cadet Boys

In the Cadet Boys Championship, Washington's Jeremiah DeMello led the way, claiming the world title with a flawless 5–0 record and an even 50.0% ringer rate. His consistency was remarkable: he topped Eben Begaye 40–27, outlasted Gavin Begaye Jr. 41–35 in a duel that featured both boys trading 50% ringers, and shut out Barron Easterwood 43–1. California's Eben Begaye finished second at 4–1, highlighted by a dominant 43–4 win over Gavin Begaye Jr., while his brother Gavin Jr. claimed third at 3–2, including a strong 41–33 win over Zachary Smith. Utah's Jacob Barney and Iowa's Smith each earned victories, with Barney edging Smith 40–22 to secure fourth place.

Competing in the Cadet Boys Championship were: Jeremiah DeMello (WA, 5–0, 50.00%), Eben Begaye (CA, 4–1, 52.58%), Gavin Begaye Jr. (CA, 3–2, 44.71%), Jacob Barney (UT, 2–3, 25.00%), Zachary Smith (IA, 1–4, 31.15%), Barron Easterwood (OK, 0–5, 6.96%).

Cadet Girls

The Cadet Girls Championship was defined by California's Kateri Navarro, who captured the crown with a perfect 5–0 mark. Navarro's highlight was a 40–4 win over Wisconsin's Jazmyn Kildahl, who finished second at 4–1. Navarro also defeated Utah's Sydney Scott 40–2 and Ashlynn Tenney 42–6, showing control throughout. Scott and Tenney tied at 2.5–2.5, with Scott edging her peer on points to take third, while Utah's Anna Barney enjoyed her first World Tournament. For these young girls, the week was a showcase of development, with Navarro's steady 31.2% ringer average leading the way.

Competing in the Junior Girls Championship were: Sadie Wolken (MO, 7–1, 44.94%), Adilaide Ohms (UT, 6–2, 47.70%), Lindy Anderson (UT, 5–2, 37.80%), Aspen Gaskins (MT, 4–3, 33.96%), Lillyan Cook (WI, 3–4, 31.90%), Natalie Dilger (NV, 2–5, 30.35%), Addison Ashton (KY, 1–6, 28.16%), Jaelynn Reynolds (UT, 1–6, 17.25%).

Junior Boys

Among the **Junior Boys**, California's **Hastiin Begaye** stood apart, running the table at 7–0 with a blistering 75.2% ringer rate. His victories included a 40–3 rout of Santonio Callado, a 40–7 win over Ryder Smith, and a 45–10 dismantling of Zack Grzembski, where he posted 84% accuracy. Massachusetts' **Grzembski** took second at 6–1, highlighted by a 41–30 win over Smith and a 40–28 victory over Callado. New Mexico's **Callado** (5–2) earned third, surviving a 45–34 slugfest against Smith and edging Kai-ba Jeff 45–35. Smith (4–3) and Kai-ba (3–4) rounded out the middle, while Utah's Tahdsoka Jeff and Vand'N Henkel gained valuable experience, each securing games that kept matches competitive.

Competing in the Junior Boys Championship were: Hastiin Begaye (CA, 7–0, 75.19%), Zack Grzembski (MA, 6–1, 69.73%), Santonio Callado (NM, 5–2, 59.76%), Ryder Smith (MT, 4–3, 54.00%), Kai-ba Jeff (CA, 3–4, 48.69%), Mike Williams (UT, 2–5, 41.61%), Tah-dsoka Jeff (CA, 1–6, 48.83%), Vand'N Hen-kel (UT, 0–7, 34.53%).

Junior Girls

The Junior Girls Championship featured a deep, balanced field, but Missouri's Sadie Wolken ultimately emerged on top with a 7–1 record and a 44.9% ringer average. Wolken's consistency was tested in a 40–34 loss to Utah's Lindy Anderson, but she responded with wins over Montana's Aspen Gaskins (40–20) and Utah's Adilaide Ohms (40–31, 40–34) to secure the title. Ohms finished runner-up at 6–2, highlighted by a 45–9 win over Addison Ashton and a 43–18 result against Natalie Dilger. Anderson (5–2) and Gaskins (4–3) followed closely, each delivering key upsets, while Wisconsin's Lillyan Cook and Utah's Jaelynn Reynolds gained wins of their own, ensuring every competitor left with a highlight. The parity of this division made it one of the week's most entertaining, with six of eight players taking multiple victories.

The World Horseshoe Tournament Men's Championship in 2025 combined drama, consistency, and precision in a way that showed why this event is what we all look forward to. The week began with a great set of preliminary rounds in Men A, where sixteen pitchers fought for their place in the championship bracket. Alan Francis emerged as the undefeated leader, finishing undefeated at 15–0 with an 82.67% ringer rate. Dan Watson (13–2, 73.0%) and Austin Bailey (12–3, 74.83%) followed as clear contenders, while Gale Greene, Dalton Rakestraw, and Ken Fraser also proved they belonged in the championship class.

Once in the finals, Francis raised the bar even higher. He finished a perfect 15–0, raising his ringer average to 86.94%. His opening game was emphatic: a 40–0 shutout of Peter Clark in which he threw 29 ringers in 30 shoes for an incredible 96.7% accuracy. Against Joseph Smith, Francis was nearly as flawless, winning 40–4 on 90.5% ringers. He continued domination against Dan Watson 40 –6 with 37 ringers on 92.3%, and in the much-anticipated showdown with Austin Bailey, Francis secured the title—posting 48 ringers and 85.7% in a 41–15 victory.

Bailey, though forced to settle for second, delivered a championship worthy performance of his own. His 14–1 record included some of the week's most dramatic contests, none bigger than his 42–31 win over Dan Watson in a clash of top contenders. He also handled Foster Kenton Jr. with a convincing 40–18 win and edged out Nathan Williams 40–12. Bailey's lone loss came to Alan Francis.

Watson, finishing third at 13–2, showed excellence in his pitching. His 40–35 shootout victory over Ben Webb highlighted his ability to match ringers under pressure; Watson put up 52 ringers (72.2%) to Webb's 52. Other victories included a 45–22 decision over Joseph Smith and a 43–32 win against Gale Greene, both secured with steady pitching.

Behind the top three, the leaderboard was full of memorable performances. Foster Kenton Jr. (10–5) had a strong week, highlighted by a 42–37 win over Randy Smith Jr. in a close-fought battle. Greene (9–6) produced one of the tournament's surprising results when he handed Bailey his only defeat, a resounding 40–1 rout. Randy Smith Jr. (8–7) also carved out key wins, including a 45–7 win over NHPA President Ben Webb. Every competitor in the final sixteen had their moments, ensuring the championship felt wide open from start to finish.

The 2025 Women's World Horseshoe Tournament delivered a blend of consistency, upsets, and high -caliber play that highlighted the depth of the women's field. The competition began with the Women A prelims, where sixteen pitchers set out to claim a spot in the championship class. Maxine Griffith of Tennessee emerged as the top qualifier with a 14–1 record and a 78.3% ringer rate, her lone loss coming narrowly in a tiebreaker-style duel with Penny Steinke, narrowly losing 21-23. Close behind was Missouri's Jennifer Gegg (12.5–2.5, 78.3%), who displayed precision in her qualifying matches, including a 35–13 win over Brandy Morehead and a tight 15–12 victory over Skyla Rioux. Rioux herself (12–3, 78.7%) finished third in the prelims, showing a knack for closing out matches, while Penny Steinke of Wisconsin (11–4, 76.2%) and Marlene Ray of Tennessee (10–5, 76.8%) also secured their championship berths. Veterans like Aleena Lepak and Amy Francis rounded out the upper bracket, while Joan Elmore and Doris Hieden also advanced.

Once the finals began, the competition intensified. Jennifer Gegg ultimately captured the world title with a 14–2 record and an impressive 81.98% ringer average. Her run was full of statement victories: a 40–0 shutout over Rhonda Cornett, a 40–4 rout of Trisha Lincoln where she hit 92.5% ringers, and a 41–22 triumph against Skyla Rioux where she outpaced her rival with 84.9% accuracy. Gegg's consistency under pressure was perhaps best exemplified in her showdown with Aleena Lepak, where she posted 55 ringers on 66 shoes (83.3%) to secure a 40–30 win. Even in her setbacks—like a hard-fought 41–23 loss to Griffith, who pitched 87.5%—Gegg's ability to rebound kept her on course for the championship.

Runner-up honors went to Rioux, whose 14–3 mark was built on a string of dominant performances. She defeated Joan Elmore 44–9 on 85% ringer shooting, edged Lepak 41–22 with 61 ringers in 72 shoes (84.7%), and defeated Amy Francis 40–13 in another win. Rioux's only challenge came against Gegg in their late-stage battles, but her consistency—rarely dipping below 70% accuracy—underscored her status as one of the premier pitchers in the field.

Griffith, finishing 13–3, matched Gegg and Rioux shot for shot in stretches and turned in some of the week's most impressive single-game highlights. Her 41–23 win over Gegg was entertaining, landing 77 ringers in 88 shoes for 87.5%. She won against Steinke 40–25 while posting over 85%, and also Joan Elmore 41–7 with 90% accuracy, a performance that reminded everyone why she led prelims.

Behind the top trio, Aleena Lepak and Penny Steinke (both 11–4) staged strong campaigns. Lepak's 42–0 shutout over Rhonda Cornett stood out with 25 of 26 ringers (96.1%), one of the tournament's most precise games. Steinke, meanwhile, knocked off Blanca Hettinga 42–19 and Marlene Ray 40–23 with steady 70% shooting. Marlene Ray (10–5) also produced highlights, including a 41–32 win over Rioux where she pitched 76 ringers out of 96 shoes (79.2%).

Though the division was smaller in numbers than the open or elder classes, the Senior Men's championship delivered its share of highlights and drama. The eight-man championship bracket was seeded from preliminary play, where New York's Ken Fraser, Arizona's Jacob Fimbres, and Massachusetts' Raymond Bedard stood out as front-runners. Fraser's 71.3% ringer rate across prelims gave him the edge entering the finals.

Fraser lived up to his past performances, capturing the 2025 world title with a perfect 7–0 record and a 71.28% ringer average. His path to the championship included a 43–10 opening win over Isai-ah Lee, a 41–9 defeat of Carroll Heaton, and a 41–4 win over Ken Heinritz. Against closer matches, Fraser edged Fimbres 41–34 while hitting 70.3% of his shoes, and sealed the championship with a 44–25 win over Bedard on the back of 68.5% shooting. Fraser pitched consistently throughout the tournament, routinely hitting above 65%, making him the clear champion.

Runner-up Fimbres (6–1, 65.8%) produced his strongest world-level performance to date. His campaign including a 42–7 win over Isaiah Lee and a 40–26 triumph over Bedard, where he landed 65% ringers. His lone loss came against Fraser, but his victories over Steven Gibson (40–4) and Carroll Heaton (41–7) displayed his ability to close out games quickly. Fimbres' progress through the week cemented him as a name to watch for future championships.

Bedard of Massachusetts claimed third at 5–2, and while his numbers (55.8% ringers) trailed the top two, he had several close wins. He opened with a 41–4 result over Heinritz, edged Ken Jones 40–10, and survived Carroll Heaton 43–33 in one of the tighter contests. His upset of Gibson (42–23) added to his résumé, though losses to both Fraser and Fimbres kept him out of the top of the group.

Utah's Steven Gibson (3–4) finished fourth, highlighted by a 45–34 win over Heinritz and a 45–24 decision over Lee. His ability to land timely ringers kept him competitive even in losses. New Mexico's Ken Jones (2–5) also claimed notable wins, including a 40–39 nail-biter against Gibson, where he matched his opponent shoe-for-shoe before pulling ahead late.

Further down the standings, Arizona's Isaiah Lee (2–5) and Utah's Carroll Heaton (2–5) each recorded wins that spoke to the depth of the field. Lee toppled Heaton 40–16 and defeated Heinritz 42–21, while Heaton bested Heinritz in a 40–39 squeaker and later edged Jones 40–34. Wisconsin's Ken Heinritz (1–6) finished last, but even he managed to upset Jones 44–32.

The 2025 Senior Women's World Horseshoe Tournament delivered everything that spectators could have hoped for. The eight-player field provided tight competition, with Washington's Cindy Clausen ultimately claiming the crown. Entering as one of the higher-seeded pitchers, Clausen justified her reputation with a 7–1 record and a 62.4% ringer rate.

Clausen's run to the title included several standout wins. She opened with a 43–16 decision over Diane Luiz, followed by a 42–28 win against California's Sandra Johnson. Against San Juanita Murray of Texas, she threw 33 ringers in 50 shoes (66%) for a 40–28 victory. One of her best games came against Sheila Shepard, where she scored 43 points with 30 ringers on 52 shoes (57.7%). Though Shepard handed Clausen her only loss—a 43–35 battle in which Shepard shot 57.7%—Clausen responded in their rematch, defeating Shepard 40–18 on the back of 43 ringers in 58 shoes (74.1%). That consistency defined Clausen's championship week.

Runner-up Shepard (6–2, 58.4%), an NHPA Hall of Fame member and ten times World Champion displayed the reason why she has won so often. After a surprising early loss to Janet Larson, she reeled off five consecutive victories, including a dominant 45–0 shutout of Susan Fulton and a 41–29 win over Kammie Anderson. Shepard's highlight came in her head-to-head with Clausen, where she outpitched the eventual champion with 30 ringers on 52 shoes (57.7%) to hand Clausen her lone defeat. Though Clausen got the better of her in the rematch, Shepard's steady accuracy and ability to rise to big moments earned her second place.

North Dakota's Anderson (4–3) and Texas' Murray (4–3) tied for the next spots. Anderson had a strong mid-tournament run with wins over Janet Larson (40–33) and Luiz (41–13). She also beat Johnson 40–36 with 36 ringers in 64 shoes, a 56.3% performance. Murray, meanwhile, played spoiler, defeating Anderson 43–37 in a tight match and scoring one of the most lopsided wins of the week with a 44–2 final over Luiz.

Kansas' Fulton (3–4) finished fifth but managed quality wins, including a 42–30 victory over Johnson and a 42–19 upset of Murray. She also outlasted Luiz 43–31 with a steady 50% ringer average. Johnson (2–5) placed sixth but grabbed wins against Larson and Luiz, while Minnesota's Larson (2–5) authored one of the week's biggest surprises by handing Shepard her only other loss, a 42–14 win with 27 ringers in 44 shoes (61.4%). Luiz, though last at 1–6, made her mark by defeating Jones 44–32 and staying competitive in several matches.

Clausen emerged victorious, but the week offered reminders that in this division, the margin between winning and losing often comes down to a handful of shoes.

The 2025 Elder Men's World Horseshoe Tournament proved to be very competitive. The Elder Men A prelims gave a taste of what was to come. Wisconsin's Jim Bilderback set the pace with a 14–1 record and a 71.2% ringer percentage, including victories over top names like Tom Moffat and Ricky Grim. Close behind was British Columbia's Moffat at 13–2 with a 75.3% average, while Utah's Benj Rains and Georgia's Zane Goggin both cleared double-digit wins. Arizona's Mike Massari and Pennsylvania's Grim rounded out the top six, leaving no doubt that the championship would be hard fought.

In the finals, Moffat rose above the rest to secure the world title with a 14–2 record and a 73.4% ringer average. His campaign included several statement victories: a 41–12 defeat of Rains on 83% shooting, a 44–7 victory against Grim with nearly 88% accuracy, and a decisive 42–14 win over Jeff Gustafson in their rematch. After dropping an earlier game to Gustafson, he answered with a stronger finish, closing the tournament on a string of emphatic wins that sealed the championship.

Gustafson, also of Wisconsin, claimed runner-up honors with a 13–3 record and a 66.8% ringer percentage. Highlights included a 44–34 victory over Del Hulet, a 42–32 decision over Kevin Shields in which he posted 51 ringers, and a narrow win against John Bruhn. Though he fell to Moffat in the final head-to-head, Gustafson's performance confirmed his place among the division's elite.

Third place went to Pennsylvania's Grim, who finished 11–4 at 67.4%. His tournament was full of high-quality wins: a 41–20 triumph over Goggin and a 43–10 defeat of Roy Buhler. Utah's Hulet (10–5) was equally impressive, including a 40–38 thriller against Rains and a 40–39 edge over Jim Bilderback. Rains himself ended 9–6, with highlights such as a 42–6 victory against Gary Boots and a 43–3 win over Joseph Cisneros. Together, the Utah duo showed the strength of the state's elder contingent.

Other notable performances came from Goggin (9–6), who pitched well against Moffat, but was still defeated 41–34 in 86 shoes. Massari (8–7) strung together wins against tough opponents, including a 45–30 result over Dave Burrows. Washington's Bruhn (8–7) delivered a signature 44–18 win over Massari, while Connecticut's Shields (7–8) surprised Moffat by shooting 68% ringers and defeated Moffat 42-38.

For the remainder of the field, the results reflected the unforgiving nature of world-class play. Veterans like Bob McCauley, Roy Buhler, and Shirl Barney all had competitive stretches but couldn't quite break into the upper tier. Even so, each took games from higher-ranked opponents. The division's newcomers, including Dave Burrows, gained invaluable experience and will likely return stronger in future years.

The 2025 Elder Women's World Horseshoe Tournament brought together six competitors in a tightly contested round robin that highlighted the endurance and precision of the sport's veteran pitchers. While the field was evenly matched in stretches, Indiana's **Sharon Chiddister** stood above the rest, finishing undefeated to capture the world title.

Chiddister was dominant throughout her 5–0 run, averaging 65.0% ringers. She opened with a 41–0 shutout of Washington's Rosalie Knutsen, then defeated Colorado's Lillian Stromberg 41–2 on a steady 73.1% accuracy. Against Arizona's Mary Fimbres, she maintained her form in a 41–14 win, and followed with a 42–11 triumph over Utah's Ellie Miller. To close her championship run, she dispatched Texas' Dee King 40–4 with 73% ringer shooting. Across all her matches, Chiddister blended efficiency and consistency, leaving little doubt about her title run.

Stromberg (3–2, 33.6%) earned the runner-up spot thanks to key wins. She outlasted King 43–34, edged Knutsen 40–26, and secured a 45–35 victory over Fimbres. Her ability to battle through high-shoe-count matches underscored her endurance. Miller of Utah also finished 3–2, placing third with a 30.1% ringer rate. She claimed narrow wins over Fimbres (40–38) and Stromberg (40–38), as well as a 44–33 decision against Knutsen, showing her knack for winning tight contests.

King, at 2–3, recorded notable wins of her own, including a 42–26 result against Miller and a 41–32 win over Knutsen, both backed by steady mid-30% accuracy. Knutsen (1–4, 31.2%) found success with a 44–32 victory over Fimbres, while Arizona's Fimbres (1–4, 29.1%) claimed her lone victory 41 –29 against King. Though their records placed them toward the bottom, both pitchers showed flashes of strong play, often pushing higher-seeded opponents across long matches.

The 2025 Elder Women's Championship underscored the competitive spirit of the division: every player secured at least one win, and no match was without its moments of drama. But the week belonged to Sharon Chiddister, whose undefeated record and steady 65% ringer pace crowned her the deserving champion.
